Proclamation

Whereas, America's system of public lands includes parks, unique landscapes, forests, wildlife refuges, historic trails, natural streams, nature centers, gardens and other landmarks that individually and collectively represent irreplaceable national resources; and

Whereas, public lands throughout Oklahoma and the nation provide natural and cultural resources for environmental learning, wildlife appreciation and recreation; and

Whereas, public lands promote stewardship, preservation, protection and recognition of public ownership; and

Whereas, shared stewardship requires goodwill, cooperation and active support of citizens, community, local and state officials and business leaders; and

Whereas, the observance of National Public Lands Day provides a extraordinary opportunity to raise awareness of the importance of land conservation and stewardship to our quality of life;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim September 26, 2015, as

"Public Lands Day"

in the state of Oklahoma and call upon the citizens of our state to recognize and participate in this special observance.
